Filip's Buggy

Filip's first seizure at just five months old was initially thought to be infantile spasms, but years later, when displaying signs of poor mobility and autism, Filip was diagnosed with Dravet Syndrome.

Filip will suffer seizures for the rest of his life and he is in danger of collapsing at any time. Mum, Gabriela knew that a standard buggy could not offer Filip adequate postural support, and as a ten year old child he still had plenty of growing to do. With the help of a social worker, a specialist pushchair was finally identified that will adapt as Filip grows and support him into his teenage years. Gabriela was disheartened to learn these models are very expensive, until the supplier told her about React.

Gabriela told us: "The buggy from React was a huge relief. It was awarded quickly, and Filip is so excited to be able to spend more time outside."

A New Bed for Harry

Claire's pregnancy was completely normal, but shortly after birth she realised something was very wrong with her newborn son. Baby Harry struggled to breathe, and it was not long before doctors realised he had a serious congenital heart defect that later contributed to a diagnosis of cerebral palsy and epilepsy.

Harry required overnight feeding and was at risk of seizures. By six years of age, after outgrowing a hospital cot, it was clear that Harry would need a specialist

profiling bed to help keep him safe and ensure he was at the correct height for his mum to tend to him. A bed with clear sides allows for easy monitoring should Harry experience a seizure or become tangled in his nutrition line.

Harry's community nurse referred the family to React, and the team were delighted to help. Claire told us: "I felt completely overwhelmed when the bed was awarded. It's been a tremendous help keeping Harry safe."

Bath Time for Louisa

Premature births are a traumatic experience for any parent. When Louisa came into the world, her parents were faced with the real probability that their newborn baby would not survive. Louisa's Dad, Lee, explained: "We are lucky she is with us at all".

Diagnosed with dystonia, epilepsy and global development delay, nine year old Louisa's needs are highly complex. Whilst she has a plethora of equipment to assist with her care, bathtimes still proved problematic.

Louisa needs to be properly supported when bathed and Dad Lee told us: "It is impossible to bathe her without help and as a single Dad, this has proved difficult". With the aid of Louisa's Occupational Therapist, Lee applied to React requesting a specialist bath chair and he was amazed by how quickly we responded: "I was relieved as I didn't expect to receive the item but React was so quick and efficient". We were delighted to help Lee and Louisa, and Dad told us: "Bathtimes are no longer an issue".





Despite a perfectly normal pregnancy, Eliza's birth was harrowing for all involved. Mum Naomi, watched as her little girl was resuscitated and then whisked away to the intensive care unit where, she would spend the first five weeks of her life.

With Eliza diagnosed with severe hypoxic ischemic encephalopathy and later, level 5 cerebral palsy, Naomi has given up work to become a full-time carer and acquiring a range of useful equipment to meet Eliza's needs has proven difficult. Naomi told us: "The local authority and NHS are limited in what they can provide."

A community nurse recommended Naomi apply to React and when we provided an activity frame for the second-hand P-Pod she'd sourced, the family were amazed by the quick turnaround.

When Eliza is in respite care or is travelling outside the home she uses a specialist buggy. However, the NHS cannot provide additional items such as rain covers and hoods which are, again, another costly expense.

Eliza has limited dexterity and her care team recommended a specialist tray to fix to the buggy to keep sensory items within her reach and, help to improve fine motor skills. So the family called on React once more. React was happy to provide both a tray and thermal cover to keep Eliza snug during the winter months. Naomi informed us: "I have found React's help empowering, and we are very grateful. Being able to get effective assistance can be overly complicated and React's service is quite liberating".

The Importance of Flooring

At just seven years old, Oasim was diagnosed with Sandhoff Disease when his mother Aisha noticed that he was becoming unsteady on his feet which led to the occasional fall.

Aisha initially had no idea how sick her son was and she was completely overwhelmed when a consultant gently explained Qasim had a rare progressive disease, affecting nerve cells in the brain and spinal cord.

The wheels of government systems move slowly but the family were eventually housed in a council property to accommodate the mobility that followed. But the home came with just bare floorboards and although

Aisha knew cheap carpeting would offer a temporary solution, this in turn would hamper Oasim's wheelchair which requires a smooth surface to glide efficiently. Seeing the cost of hard flooring, Aisha knew her purse strings would not stretch that far and she didn't know where else to turn until the family's hospice social worker referred her to React.

Aisha told us "The new flooring has made so much difference - Qasim can still walk a few steps around the house and his wheelchair glides easily on the hard surface, React has brought peace of mind to our whole family."
