Safe Journeys for Phoebe


At just four weeks old, tiny new-born Phoebe was

rushed into hospital when concerned mum Emma noticed she was shaking rapidly. Doctors recognised infantile spasms and Phoebe was admitted to hospital for the next six months where she experienced between 40 to 100 seizures a day.

Now aged two, adorable Phoebe has been diagnosed with Ohtahara Syndrome and West Syndrome, which are very rare types of epilepsy and neurological disorders. She has significant Global Developmental Delay and limited head control but she loves nothing more than playing with her brother Alfie and sister Lilly.

React has worked with Phoebe and her family since her diagnosis, during difficult times when there was no other support: "When Phoebe was in hospital, it was an extremely tough and emotional time for us. Phoebe was vomiting after every seizure which was terrifying and we honestly didn't know what to do. A nurse suggested React, who have helped us so much ever since."

Most recently, the family were finding car journeys with Phoebe very problematic when the slightest bump or turn meant Phoebe's head would droop. During seizures, Emma would urgently pull over and monitor her daughter, only driving again when Phoebe recuperated. The family's nurse recommended purchasing a specialist car seat,





A Good Night's Rest



Catherine and Jackie had no idea that the birth of their much wanted baby would be so traumatic. Their new-born son struggled to breathe his first breath for 20 harrowing minutes and they were given devastating news that he was unlikely to survive his first night.

Defying doctors predictions, Jack is now seven years old and lives with Cerebral Palsy and Epilepsy. He is entirely reliant on his parents and Jack's complex condition means he is at risk of his oxygen levels dropping whilst sleeping. Catherine and Jackie have spent every night wide awake terrified for their son's safety. When Jack relapsed and was admitted to hospital after a prolonged seizure, the family were desperate for help and the lack of sleep was having a detrimental effect on them all.

Jack's Nurse recommended a SATS Monitor which would sound an alarm if Jack's oxygen dropped to a dangerous level. In total despair and anxious about going home, Jack's Nurse referred the family to React:

"Leaving the hospital without a monitor was absolutely terrifying but React provided one so quickly. The turnaround time was incredible and it's been an absolute godsend for us, giving us such reassurance and more sleep at night."



Better Bath Times

Four year old Ted is described by his parents as the 'happiest boy you'll ever meet' and in spite of his health, Ted's contagious smile never disappears.

Diagnosed at birth with Spina Bifida, Hydrocephalus and a Gene Mutation, Ted is blind, epileptic and paralysed from the waist down. Bath times are Ted's favourite part of the day and he loves the water. However, the bulky bath seat provided by the local authority was too big for the family's bath tub and left Ted dangling above the water.

Ted's Mum has given up work to care for him and the family's finances are stretched. Wanting to give their son his love of bath times back, Ted's Physiotherapist helped the family apply to React for a Splashy Seat:

"React is my favourite charity and I tell everyone about it. The understanding and sympathy of the team is so nice and instead of years on a waiting list, they're there every time Ted needs something."

Without the strain on Mum and Dad, and finally a supportive bath seat, Ted can now enjoy as many baths as he wants!





Huzaifah's New Suit

Huzaifah was a contented, happy baby who was achieving all his milestones. It was when he was just six months old mum Sehrish knew something wasn't quite right: "His eyes were beginning

to roll into the back of his head and he wasn't holding his head up or interacting with toys, it was a complete worry" said Sehrish. Huzaifah was admitted to hospital for a gruelling two weeks of tests, and it was then the family were given the devastating news. Huzaifah has an extremely rare metabolic disease and only eight children in the UK are known to have the same condition.

Considered a fairly new discovery, the symptoms of AADC Deficiency are similar to those of Parkinson's disease and now aged four, Huzaifah finds it difficult to support his body and head. Over the years, Huzaifah has benefitted greatly from the use of a Lycra suit, which improves body awareness and stability, even getting to the point where he can now roll over and hold his head up himself. So when their son outgrew the suit, Sehrish was determined to find another and applied to React.

"Without his Lycra suit, I don't think Huzaifah would be sitting up or rolling over right now. He's improved so much physically because of it and it's made a huge difference to his life."

For children living with a life-threatening condition, a simple cold or chest infection can be serious. Six year old Audrey who lives with a very rare chromosome disorder, Trisomy 9 Mosaicism needed to be immediately hospitalised when a simple cold led to respiratory difficulties and requiring an emergency tracheostomy.

Freedom for Audrey

On leaving hospital, the family were handed a bulky suction machine to use for clearing Audrey's airways. The machine was heavy and extremely noisy, giving off a loud and harsh vacuum sound each time it was used. Adding to the copious amount of equipment Audrey already needed, a simple trip to the shop became a mammoth task for the family and affected Audrey, who loves visiting new places.

Seeing first-hand the complications the family were experiencing, Audrey's Doctor recommended approaching React for a lighter, compact suction machine.

"The new suction machine has been such a big relief, it's lighter and noise free, easily fitting in Audrey's backpack when we go out."



Support for Louie

There is only one thing that six year old Louie loves more than watching Toy Story, and that is relaxing in his new Symmetrikit Chair! Louie uses it every day and it allows him to spend time with siblings in the living room rather than confined to his bed or wheelchair.



Young Mum Natalie was just 21 years old when she gave birth and, when baby Louie's feet and legs started to stiffen, the family knew something wasn't quite right. Spending his first ever Christmas in intensive care followed by months as an inpatient, Louie was diagnosed with SMARD, a progressive motor neuron disease. "It's not what you imagine, being a young Mum with a child who has a life-limiting illness but we have grown together and he has changed me so much" said Natalie.

Louie requires a tracheostomy, ventilator and 24 hour monitoring and when he began to experience seizures lasting up to five terrifying hours, his Physiotherapist recommended a more supportive seating system.

"Louie adores his new chair and it's so much easier to handle. He's now on level with his siblings and it allows him to be involved so much more. He loves to paint on his new seat tray and it's just made his life a lot more comfortable. React really does 'react' fast and has helped so much."
