### Car Comfort for Harry

Harry was born prematurely and spent the first five months of his life in hospital.

Just days after he was discharged, Harry was rushed back to hospital and needed emergency heart surgery, much to the anguish of his parents, Marlene and David.

Harry is now three years old and lives with complex medical needs, including Chronic Lung Disease and Tracheobronchomalacia, a condition that affects his airways. Harry requires a ventilator to assist with his breathing, especially during the night. He has low muscle tone which means his mobility is limited and he needs additional support with head control and body movement. Harry is a happy child, who thrives in the company of others and loves singing songs.

Due to the level of care Harry requires, his parents take him to weekly hospital and physiotherapy appointments. The continual travel caused great discomfort for Harry and he needed a car seat which can be adjusted to support his head and body. Following a referral from a physiotherapist, React was happy to help.

Harry can now travel safely, much to the relief of his parents. "The car seat has made a huge difference for Harry, thank you so much React for your help!"



## Portable Hoist for Cassie

When Cassie was born her parents were thrilled to bring home a thriving baby and introduce her to older

sister Shannon. However, over time it was apparent Cassie was not meeting the usual developmental milestones and at 17 months old, she was referred by her GP for tests.

Mum Tracie remembers the day like it was yesterday when Cassie was diagnosed with Rett Syndrome, a genetic neurological disorder that causes profound physical and neurological disabilities. "At the time, I had no understanding of what the doctors were telling me and it wasn't until I'd done endless research that I understood what the condition meant". Cassie's devastated parents watched as their beautiful daughter deteriorated and by the age of four, Cassie had lost her ability to walk.

Now aged 14, Cassie needs full time care and has undergone many medical procedures including spinal fusion surgery to straighten her back. A portable hoist was recommended by the occupational therapist involved in Cassie's care who approached React for help. We were delighted to assist and having now recovered from her surgery, the family are making good use of the hoist by taking Cassie out. They even managed a trip to the local swimming pool!

Tracie said "React is a godsend. As Cassie's full time carer, a portable hoist is the only way I can safely move Cassie. React responded to our application in a matter of days, they are amazing".

# Walking with Confidence

for Aayan



Aayan was born a healthy baby boy and his parents were overjoyed to welcome their son into the world. However, at just three months old, Aayan experienced spasms which worryingly led to rapid seizures. Within months Aayan was diagnosed with Global Developmental Delay and Hypotonia which affects his mobility, cognitive ability and speech.

Aayan, now aged seven, is a happy child who shares a very close bond with his older, protective sister, Yusra. Aayan is unable to move unaided and following an appointment with a Physiotherapist, a walker was recommended for home use.

Aayan's physiotherapist referred the family to React who was delighted to help. The walker enables Aayan to practice his walking, whilst building up his muscle strength and he is gaining a huge amount of confidence. It also provides Aayan with some much needed independence and he can direct the walker where he wants to go, especially handy when "chasing" his big sister!

Aayan's Mother Firdousie, said "We were originally told Aayan would never walk and with React's help, he has proved everyone wrong. Although our son's illness is permanent, by using the walker now, we hope one day Aayan can take steps independently, even if it is only for a short distance".


### Safe Sleeping for Charlie

Within a couple of days of her birth, baby Charlie began fitting and stopped breathing. It was a terrifying time for her parents and sadly this was not to be the last time they would witness a seizure.

Charlie was closely monitored and her GP referred her at just one year old to a neurologist. The diagnosis was not good; Charlie was diagnosed with multiple complex conditions including Global Developmental Delay and Epilepsy. She is also undergoing genetic testing due to further symptoms which cause Charlie to collapse without warning.

Now aged seven, Charlie is a strong, resilient little girl who loves music, watching movies and entertaining her two younger brothers. She tries to be independent and whizzes around in her wheelchair; although such bravery has been a cause for concern, especially when Charlie made several attempts to climb out of her hed! This night time behaviour was a serious worm

made several attempts to climb out of her bed! This night time behaviour was a serious worry for her parents and they became more and more anxious, spending each night listening for the 'thump' which meant Charlie had tried to escape again.



Mum, Emma told us, "React has been amazing. The safe bed has made a huge difference to Charlie and our family life".



Baby Dafydd was born prematurely and admitted to a special care baby unit for observation. Shortly after his admission,



Dafydd's parents received the devastating news their little boy has a range of complex conditions including Hydrocephalus, which causes excess fluid to the brain. Dafydd was also diagnosed with Neo-Natal Meningitis and Epilepsy.

Now aged eleven, Dafydd has profound disabilities and relies on a wheelchair for mobility. He needs round-the-clock care from both parents and requires regular hospital admission due to epileptic seizures. This happy young man enjoys being entertained by his younger brother, whom he often laughs at for getting into mischief!

The reality of Dafydd's physical limitations, coupled with the need to stay close to a hospital due to regular seizures, meant the opportunity for family travel was an almost impossible feat.

Dafydd's family were made aware of React through a social worker, who recommended a folding wheelchair ramp to enable Dafydd to travel easily and provide access to a variety of places.

After a swift application to React, the family can now look forward to a break away in a React mobile home and also have the reassurance that Dafydd will continue to enjoy getting "out and about". Dafydd's Mum Juliet said, "Things have been difficult to manage and we are grateful for everything, thank you so much."
