Support for **Short Lives**

Whilst Harrison's Mother, Georgia, knew it was never going to be an easy birth because his twin had passed away in the womb, it proved far more traumatic than anyone could

have predicted as she went into labour three months prematurely.

Born weighing only one pound, Harrison spent the next 18 weeks in an incubator as his health remained touch and go.

Harrison's doctors attempted to take him off oxygen once he seemed to be improving but it was then found that he had prolific lung damage, considered to be unsurvivable. The news was unbearable for Harrison's parents and they were resolute in spending every available moment with their beloved newborn.

As Harrison remained an in-patient, an application was made to React to assist with travel costs for Georgia and his Father, Mathew, who had to give up work to be there. React wasted no time in providing this help, which gave the family vital support when it mattered most. React is pleased to say Harrison has made progress since and is now out of hospital.

of Sophia's life, it became

apparent that Sophia was not meeting her developmental milestones. Doctors could not identify the cause, even after an MRI scan.

At six months, genetic testing revealed an extremely rare neurological illness related to her GNAO1 Gene. Since then, she has experienced involuntary movement episodes, known as 'storms'. During these, Sophia's limbs move independently, as if she is running involuntarily.

Now nine, Sophia is on medication to manage her illness, and has a fitted deep-brain-stimulating device. Her Mother Sima said to us: "Sophia can experience a storm at any time so we can only try to look forwards and focus on the present. This can be very difficult, but we do our best to keep her stable and happy. She is a lovely, giggly little girl, who always wakes up smiling even if she has been in movement episodes for the entire night".

Specialist seating is needed to keep Sophia correctly positioned throughout the day and keep her secure during her movement storms. A 'P-Pod' seat was identified by a physiotherapist as a solution, but with no local authority help available, the family were referred to React. Sima said: "The speed with which React came through to help was amazing. Everyone can see how happy and comfortable she looks sitting in the P-Pod and it helps her through the storms".

Pure Relief & Comfort

Before his diagnosis, twelve-year-old
Alfie was known for his infectious
energy, cheeky sense of humour, and
love of cuddles with Mum, Dad, and his
two siblings. Life took an unexpected
turn when, following an MRI scan and
genetic testing, Alfie was diagnosed
with Adrenoleukodystrophy (ALD), a
rare genetic disorder that affects the
nervous system.

Since his diagnosis in December 2021, Alfie's condition has deteriorated rapidly. By February 2022, Alfie lost his mobility and by March, he lost his ability to

speak. Now receiving palliative care, Alfie's condition has caused severe scoliosis, impacting his posture and comfort. Heart-breakingly, Alfie's siblings were also found to carry the same genetic condition, something Mum never imagined would happen to her children.

With support of Alfie's Physiotherapist and Social Worker at his local Children's Hospice, Alfie's family submitted an application to React for a Stabilo Grande Support Mattress to support Alfie's posture and enable floor play time with his siblings and comforting cuddles with Mum, Rachael. Rachael described the moment she heard the application was successful as a moment of "pure relief", knowing it would bring Alfie some comfort and support during such a challenging time.



Following a traumatic emergency caesarean, new-born Jack was given a brain scan which revealed he had suffered a stroke during labour, causing severe brain damage. Jack was later diagnosed with Lennox-Gastaut Syndrome and his mother, Helen, explained to us, that at the time she did not quite understand the impact it would have: "The initial shock was huge but it was only after the dust settled that we realised the usual milestones would not be met. It was a big adjustment over the first year and he cried constantly throughout that period. Once we learned to live with his care needs things became easier and now, of our three children, Jack is the most laid back".

Now aged 11, Jack loves the outdoors, especially visiting a local animal farm. Being in nature soothes Jack and helps ease his seizures, but his wheelchair made access difficult. Jack's physiotherapist suggested outdoor wheels yet with no other funding available, the family couldn't afford them.

With the help of Jack's physiotherapist an application was made to React, and Helen was amazed by the speed of the response: "We had doubts when we applied and I did not want to get my hopes up, but the application process was so simple, and the charity's response was so quick".

Isabelle's Sensory Chair

Isabelle is a very happy and smiley little four-yearold with plenty of sass and a smile that lights up the whole room. After an uncomplicated birth, Isabelle was soon diagnosed with TAPVD, a defect where the veins in the heart are not connected to the right areas, and she was rushed into surgery. It was not long after this that Mum, Laura, held concerns and through her persistence, managed to get a further diagnosis - Hydrocephalus (meaning water on the brain) and so followed another emergency surgery.

Life for the family became filled with hospital visits, feeding struggles, and financial pressures. Isabelle, who responds well to sensory stimulation and loves rocking, had outgrown her toddler chair. Her occupational therapist recommended a Gravity Chair, but its cost was beyond reach.

React, having previously supported the family with a blender, reassured the family that there is no limit

on the support we provide. Laura said the moment she saw Isabelle in the new chair was "incredible" and moved her to tears, making a "huge difference to a smiling Isabelle." The Gravity Chair now provides comfort. independence, and family time together.
